

## Funded Beds at Delta View?



Access to funded beds is managed by the Fraser Health Authority Case Manager.

The B.C. Ministry of Health can subsidize the fee (per diem) for care at DVLEC if the client is financially eligible.

Contact **Fraser South Central Intake** by calling **604-953-4965** Monday to Friday from 8:00am-4:00pm and saying "Reception".

A Fraser Health Case Manager will refer you to someone who will conduct a financial assessment on your loved-one. If your loved-one is eligible, they will be placed on a funded bed wait list.

The wait list can range from 3-5 years and is operated under the First Available bed policy in a facility of choice.

You will have to rank your facility choices and accept the first available bed that opens in one of those facilities in order to take advantage of the funded bed.

Arrangements for Private Pay beds can be made through contacting the Admissions Assistant and DVLEC Administration directly.

## What to Expect on Move-In Day

Admissions are arranged for 11:00am.

You will be greeted at reception and accompanied to your home by a nurse from the house as well as the admissions coordinator.

Important consent forms must be completed by the authorized family member on the day of admission. This will include the Degree of Intervention form. Please ask your nurse and admission coordinator for more information.

It will be important to bring at least 7 days worth of all clothing including under garments and non-skid shoes. Please ensure that clothing is seasonally-appropriate.

We welcome one family member to be our lunch guest on move-in day. One complimentary meal ticket will be given to that family member and any other meal tickets can be purchased at Reception for \$7.00 each.



The building is open from 8:00am to 8:00pm but please visit between the hours of 10:00am to 8:00pm.

## Admission to Delta View...

Admission for funded beds is determined by a Residential Case Manager, the timing and criteria being decided by the Access Coordinators.

Our mandate is to provide care to those who meet the criteria for admission to this facility.

We are part of the larger provincial Continuing Care program – our residents come from all parts of British Columbia and beyond.

It is important to remember that admission to residential care does not need to be considered a permanent placement. If a resident's health and ability to manage independently improves, alternative arrangements will be discussed with the resident and their family.

Residents' abilities and health status' do change. Your loved-one may move into one house but eventually be transferred to another within DVLEC in order for their needs to best be met. Delta View administration reserves the right to conduct these internal moves in order to best serve all of our residents.

The care team is available to assist with planning discharge from DVLEC. If this is the case, we would ask that all personal items are removed from the facility within 24 hours of discharge and that resident's and families be aware that DVLEC will dispose of items left unclaimed over 30 days as we are unable to store unclaimed property.

Delta View Life Enrichment Centre encourages and supports short term absences from the facility so our residents may maintain contact with family and friends.



## The Day You Move In...

Moving day can be busy, stressful and very tiring. The following list suggests some preparations that can be made before the move into our facility if coming from home.

### Moving checklist

- Make arrangements with a moving company or family.
- Pack all items being brought with you to Delta View

- Newspaper delivery

- Cable television
- BC telephone service
- BC newspaper service

## How to Make It "Home"...

Upon arrival to Delta View, a nurse will escort you and your loved-one to their home and will assist them to settle in. Once settled, the nurse will then ask for information that will assist the care team to prepare a personalized care plan.

Resident rooms are furnished with an electric bed with pressure relieving mattress, a night table, a wardrobe, a desk, staff call bell and separate lighting.

All bedrooms have their own washroom with a toilet, sink and shower. Whilst space is limited, residents are encouraged to bring favorite possessions as space allows. Some suggestions are:

*Please note; all electrical items must be checked and tagged by our Maintenance Department PRIOR to use!*



- Small framed pictures or ornaments
- Washable comforter or blanket
- Small radio with headphones (CSA approved)
- Small television with headphones (CSA approved)
- Family photos, calendar, books, tapes, clock

**THESE ITEMS ARE NOT PERMITTED INSIDE DELTA VIEW:** Electrical heating pads, electric blankets, electric massagers (foot/back etc), electric recliners that include heating pads and/or vibrators, extension cords and personal refrigerators are not permitted for safety reasons. Bags that contain "beans" and are heated in the microwave to act as a heating pad, rugs and open razors are also not permitted for safety reasons.

**Male residents** should bring an electric shaver. It is the responsibility of the resident or family member to keep them in working condition.



**FURNISHINGS:** You are welcome to bring in pictures and personal items that will help you feel at home.

We encourage residents to decorate their rooms with personal items such as pillows, bed coverings, wall pictures, a large faced clock, house plants and family photos to add warmth and personality to your room.

**CLOTHING & FOOTWEAR:** Should be loose and comfortable. Garments that are machine washable and dryable or are permanent press are best. Shoes require safe, non-skid soles.

Follow this suggested list of clothing:

- One pair of shoes with rubber or other safe sole
- One pair of slippers with non-skid soles
- Seven days supply of underclothing, socks, stockings
- Seven days supply of sweaters, pants, shirts etc
- Seven days supply of night clothes
