Delta View Visiting Tips

Visiting Hours: 10:00 am - 8:00 pm

GARDENS

The Delta View campus has various gardens throughout the grounds. Spend some time in the large rose garden with water feature located between DVLEC and DVH, or the calming garden and gazebo, accessible behind DVH with staff assistance.

It is important to remember that these locations are not secured, so residents must be accompanied by staff or visitors.

DECKS & COURTYARDS

There are two large decks on the second floor of DVLEC that can be accessed during sunny days. The front deck is wheelchair accessible, whereas the back deck has a few stairs leading to its' access.

All first floor Homes in DVLEC and DVH have secured courtyards, and all second floor Homes in DVLEC have balconies. Staff can grant access to courtyards and balconies upon request.

ROOM BOOKINGS & CATERING

Is it difficult for your loved one to leave Delta View? Consider celebrating birthdays and holiday events by booking a room in Delta View. There are several rooms with varying capacities. Catering is also a possible option, or feel free to bring a potluck, pizza or other treats you may want.

LIBRARY BOOKS

You will find library books within all Homes and in the hallways of DVLEC. In addition, Fraser Valley Regional Library Outreach Program delivers a number of books every three months. They are kept in the Cascades Activity Room and Cascades staff or recreation staff can assist you and your loved one to sign them out.

If your loved one is no longer able to read, try reading aloud to them. Grandchildren can show off (and practice!) their reading skills while their grandparent listens.

PETS ARE FAMILY TOO!

Friendly, house trained pets are welcome at Delta View. They must be on a leash and are welcome everywhere except the kitchen and dining areas. Please check with staff before sharing your pet with co-residents due to potential allergies or in case they are fearful.

HALL-WALKS

Delta View's hallways seem to go on for miles, so what better way to get some exercise than to walk them! Find a new spot to sit during each visit, or find a favourite spot to end-up each time. The solarium on the first floor of DVLEC is always a favourite.

Free WIFI can be found in the solarium or can be purchased for \$5/day, \$20/week or \$50/month. Please speak to a receptionist for assistance and more information.

RECREATION PROGRAMS

Monthly calendars can be found posted in each Home. Special Event calendars are posted at Reception desks and in the elevators.

If it is beneficial for your loved one, you are welcome to join them in their own Home's programs. Examples of some common programs include Music Therapy, BINGO, card club, bowling and socials.

If your presence is distracting, try to plan visits before a program so transitioning your loved one into the program will ease the family's exit.

Find out from the recreation staff which programs your loved one can attend in other Homes. Please be aware that many programs are created towards the needs of the resident in that Home. Not all programs are appropriate for all residents.

PLACES TO GO OFF-SITE

On sunny days, who doesn't like a bit of fresh air? Consider taking your loved one for a treat at Tim Horton's or Triple O's. There is a sidewalk all the way down Burns Drive with a bench halfway, looking over farm fields towards the mountains - a great spot to rest.

Should your loved one need wheelchair accessible transport or special attention during drives, the HandyDart is a possible option to help with off-site visits.

Talk to the social worker about signing your loved one up with HandyDart if you think they would enjoy going to the beach, a restaurant, or family dinner event, for example.

BILLIARDS ROOM

Shoot some pool in this room located on the second floor of DVLEC. You will need to ask for a key at the Reception Desk and leave a \$20 deposit.

Even if your loved one cannot play pool, they may appreciate watching and listening to a game they used to enjoy.

Keep an eye out for visiting baskets, sold at special events and sometimes in the coffee shop. Arranged by the Volunteer Society, these baskets are themed and will give you tools and ideas to help you have an entertaining and meaningful visit.
